Our beliefs and vision

Affiliated with the Baptist Union of Great Britain, we are aligned to its statement of principle which is:

1. That our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ, God manifest in the flesh, is the sole and absolute authority in all matters pertaining to faith and practice, as revealed in the Holy Scriptures, and that each Church has liberty, under the guidance of the Holy Spirit, to interpret and administer His laws.
2. That Christian Baptism is the immersion in water into the Name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, of those who have professed repentance towards God and faith in our Lord Jesus Christ who 'died for our sins according to the Scriptures; was buried, and rose again the third day'.
3. That it is the duty of every disciple to bear personal witness to the Gospel of Jesus Christ, and to take part in the evangelisation of the world.

The Vision of Rothwell Baptist Church is to be a **welcoming, caring, all-age church, telling the good news about Jesus to our community and making disciples in our neighbourhood and beyond**

Welcoming – People often compliment us on how welcoming all our events are. We want to remember that this is a strength and never let it slip.

For I was hungry and you gave me something to eat, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you invited me in (Matthew 25:35)

Caring – We are in contact with people in need, members who are ill and infirm, people of all ages with special needs and/or poor mental health. We want to care for and show the Love love of Jesus to anyone in our community who is suffering in some way..

A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another: just as I have loved you, you also are to love one another. By this all people will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another. (John 13:34-35)

All Age – Our members and those who attend the church range in age from the youngest children to many who are senior in years. Our worship and caring services are accessible to all these ages and not exclude anyone because of age.

Jesus said, "Let the little children come to me, and do not hinder them, for the kingdom of heaven belongs to such as these. (Matthew 19:14)

Telling the Good News – We tell it every Sunday and in all our church-run events. We are true to what it says in the Bible and this truth is core to who we are and how we behave.

*'The Spirit of the Lord is on me,
because he has anointed me
to proclaim good news to the poor.
He has sent me to proclaim freedom for the prisoners
and recovery of sight for the blind,
to set the oppressed free,
to proclaim the year of the Lord's favour. (Luke 4:18-19)*

Making Disciples – This is the embodiment of the Great Commission; it also leads to the growth of the Church. We want to see disciples in our community growing in knowledge and faith, rather than focusing on increasing numbers of people attending church on Sunday mornings.

Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptising them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age.’ (Matthew 19-20)

Our Activities

Sunday Worship

Our regular main worship service takes place each Sunday at 11:00 AM (although occasionally this may vary so it's a good idea to check with the web site). The first part of the service is all-age and has content suitable to young and old. About halfway through the service, the children leave for separate "Children's Worship" which is content suitable for the various ages on the day.

Approximately every two months, we hold a family service which is suitable for all-ages all the way through.

Our services are also accessible using Zoom and we record each service and make the recordings available on-line to the members of our congregation.

Every month, we also offer an informal evening service followed by a "bring and share" tea.

Safeguarding

The church recognises its responsibilities in safeguarding all children, young people and adults at risk, regardless of gender, ethnicity or ability.

The members of the church are committed to the nurturing, protection and safekeeping of all associated with the church and will pray for them regularly. In pursuit of this, they have agreed the safeguarding policy which can be viewed or downloaded using the link below. The church is committed to this policy and to the development of sound procedures to ensure it implements the policy well.

If anyone is considered to be in imminent danger of harm, a report should be made immediately to the police by calling 999. If such a report is made without reference to the Designated Person for Safeguarding, they should be informed as soon as possible afterwards.

The duty of the person who receives information or who has a concern about the welfare of a child, young person or adult at risk is to **RECOGNISE** the concerns, make a **RECORD** in writing and **RESPOND** by passing on their concerns to the Designated Person for Safeguarding.
